SUBJECT: MOVING OF DIAMOND DRILL CORE  
FROM MINE AIR STRIP

DATE: October 7, 1974

The near future expansion of the tailings pond will flood an area on which original drill core from the Faro ore bodies is stored. It is proposed that this core be moved from the present site to a location near the new core racks on the mine dump.

This core should be saved because: (1) It can be used for future engineering and geological studies; (2) Most of it is large diameter (N size) and therefore represents the best obtainable sample of host rock and ore; (3) Much of it is the only remaining sample of the mined out portion of the orebody; (4) The cost of moving the core would be equal or less to redrilling a similar size hole.

Outside labor under overall Cyprus Anvil supervision will be used to move the core and core racks, reassemble and reshelve the core. Outside help is required because neither the engineering nor exploration departments have personnel to spare, except for general supervision, for the time that would be required to move the core. Time is of the essence for this move because of the tailings pond expansion and the oncoming winter weather conditions.

Zane Clark, Mine Foreman, has approached the exploration department and expressed a desire to contract the core moving job. The agreement between him and Cyprus Anvil is attached.

**CYPRUS**


The following is an agreement between Cyprus Anvil Mining Corporation and Zane Clark whereby Clark will provide certain services on a contract basis. The services and conditions are outlined below:


All core and core racks located at the mine air strip will be moved to a designated location on one of the mine benches. The core will be replaced in the proper sequences to the satisfaction of Cyprus Anvil.

To accomplish this: (1) Zane Clark will provide all required labor and flatbed truck. Rates to be charged to Cyprus Anvil are \$5.50/man hour worked and \$28.00/day for truck.

(2) Cyprus Anvil will provide overall supervision as to boxing, labelling of core boxes; provide a cleared level site to which core racks will be moved; provide equipment, such as bulldozer, for moving of core racks; fuel and oil for flatbed truck.

(3) Every effort will be made to have all core and racks moved and core restacked by November 1, 1974.
