Dear Bob:

I have today reviewed Anvil's claim holdings and assessment work with Messrs. Macdonald, Hampton and Grant. This was done to decide upon which claims can safely be allowed to lapse, in view of the immediate work requirements.

I am in general agreement with the recommendations contained in Mr. Hampton's letter dated August 31, 1967, with the exceptions noted below (the MOR and NASTY groups). Therefore, I propose the following procedure:

- 1 - Retain the MOR group of 88 mining claims. This group lies across the general trend of the mineral zone and should be held for the present. A gravimetric survey can be completed sufficient to hold those claims with a deadline coming in December, 1967. This part consists of 32 claims.
- 2 - With regard to the ACE and LAUREL claim groups, let lapse those portions as recommended by Mr. Hampton if no ore or encouraging mineralization be cut in holes to be drilled on ACE and LAUREL before their respective deadlines this fall.
- 3 - Also, if no encouragement be gained from the results of geochemical testing to be done this fall on the NASTY group, let it lapse as recommended by Mr. Hampton, except for a buffer strip two claims wide against the Comince property on the South (a total of 22 buffer claims).

4 - Let the other groups lapse as proposed in Mr. Hampton's letter.

In future years this matter of claim lapsing should be brought to a decision not later than July 31.
