Dear Ted:

Here is a typical freeze-up story on a mineral find on the Arctic watershed that you may be able to verify.

Jack Smith, field man for Anaconda and a party of Boyles drillers complete with gear went in to the Port Moresby area last weekend to drill a new find over freeze-up. Some 4 tons of gear and supplies were flown via Yellowknife after they had to abandon a routing via Mayo, when Khondike Helicopters were unable to supply a machine to lift the outfit in on the last leg of the trip.

Attached is a map of the reported location of the find on the south side of Fitton Mtn. The find is reported to be a base metal one: Texas Oil Co are reported to be involved in the matter: Cassiar Asbestos attempted to get into the area last week and cracked up an aircraft on landing in the area.

The only reported mineral find in the area is Hoidahl's wolframite, molybdenite find on the north side of Mt Fitton, associated with granitic rocks.
