Dear Glen:

I have a report from our Yukon crew and wish to pass on some of the results from our joint venture.

The program is progressing smoothly and satisfactorily. The crew have recently moved from Margaret Lake to the Dempster Highway to complete this season's work. Several groups of claims have been staked and they are outlined below:

- i) An area within ten miles of the Archer and Cathro showing was staked with 16 claims to cover a 500 ppm Zn anomaly. Ground checking did not disclose any mineralization however a silicified dolomite breccia was noted in the anomalous area.
- ii) A 2300 ppm Zn anomaly on a creek flowing into the Hart River was staked. A gossanous creek is underlain by a reefoid complex and a shale. No mineralization has been located and evaluation is continuing.
- iii) Four claims have been staked to cover a zinc carbonate showing on Rapitan Creek. One sample assayed 2.3% zinc and occurs in limestones and limestone breccias.
- iv) The BEV 1-20 claims appear very promising. A 1600 ppm zinc anomaly was located in a creek which has been traced up to a zinc carbonate showing. The host rock is a yellow dolomite with almost complete filling of the porosity with secondary carbonate. A facies front appears to traverse the area.
- v) At present the crew is following up an anomaly in the Snake River area where sphalerite, galena and zinc carbonate have been found in breccias and zebra dolomites.



All anomalies that are followed up undergo only brief prospecting. If the rocks in an anomalous area are felt to be favorable for ore deposition a small group of claims are staked to cover the drainage. It was felt that due to the competitive pressures in the general area this would be the best method to follow.

I hope this provides you with a feeling for the progress of the work and I will keep you posted on further developments. Best of luck with your work in the Faro area.
