Dear Mr. Chow:

We visited your Pelly claims in the Yukon on August 18, 1980 and attempted to conduct geothermal logging of the diamond drillholes. We located boreholes KP78-1 and KP78-2 but unfortunately were unsuccessful in obtaining a log at either site as the holes had frozen over. KP78-1 was blocked by ice at 59 ft; KP 78-2 at 11 ft. We therefore only searched briefly for KP 78-3 and though we did not locate it, we presume it to be in a similar condition.

Thank you for letting us attempt these measurements. Should you be planning any drilling in the Yukon during 1981 which might be suitable to geothermal logging we would be pleased to know if any holes are available.
