I discussed this matter with Paul Kavanagh and he would like to have Duncan Crone review the gravity data before making a final decision regarding the recording. I will send your data to Toronto this afternoon. From our experience at Swim Lakes however, I am not very impressed with a .1 milligal gravity anomaly.

I do not quite know what else one could do with the Davie Group other than to do more gravity on the other untested magnetic anomalies.

As you know, the geochemical picture is not really very impressive as compared for example with the soil geochemistry over the Faro deposit. I have not seen the Faro geochemical map, but Kulan told me some time ago that the Faro area was ideal for geochemistry.

You mentioned in a previous report that you intended to do EM work over the more easterly magnetic anomalies on the Davie Group and I wondered if this had ever been accomplished.

Perhaps you have a number of reasons for suggesting the recording of these claims and I would appreciate your summarizing these for me.

Another problem is that I would not, in the light of present knowledge, know which claims to retain. You can therefore forget about recording any portion of the Davie Group.
