Cecil Poli of Mayo called in here with the enclosed information on his Leo group, tying onto Jack Gerletski's find near the old Silver King Mine, Keno Hill, Yukon. Dr. H. Froberg representing Tech-Huges optioned the group last year, and the year before from Pauli. He attempted to throw Gerletski's ground in with the deal, but could not get Keno Hill to come to terms. Keno Hill owns an undivided 50% of Gerletski's ground under option from Jim Gaullie now deceased.

In any event Froberg drilled 4 holes on the resistivity anomaly and gravity anomalies referred to in Clark's report. One of the holes was spotted over the gravity anomaly, but failed to reach bed rock. Two other holes were spotted 100 and 200 feet west of the first, and the fourth hole 100 feet south of the first. As the results show, nothing of interest was intersected, but the most important hole over the gravity anomaly failed to get down to bed rock. The results are inconclusive. Froberg dropped the ground last year and Poli has been trying to interest others without success.

It looks pretty tough, but I am forwarding the information to you in case you wish to look it over next year.
