This four-claim group belongs to Mr. Alex Nichol of 4005 West 28th Avenue, Vancouver. Mr. Nichol is approximately 80 years of age.

You may recall that this is the group from which Mr. Nichol is said to have shipped 3 tons of float, having a total value of \$11,000.00. He also is supposed to have shipped 75 tons of ore averaging 300 ozs. to the ton.

The total purchase price for the four claims is \$15,000.00. Mr. Nichol has held the ground since 1919 and holds it now on a 20-year lease.

Angus MacDonald advises that the vein was 16' wide at the point from which the 75 ton shipment was made.

It would appear that we should examine this property when opportunity permits.
