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FRANCES RIVER SYNDICATE

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We have finally received a geological map and a geochemical map of the claim area. Obviously, very little silt sampling was done during the program and we have been a little concerned about the fact that a geochemical anomaly shows up two miles south of the south limit of the claims. I talked to Gordon Davis in the absence of Mr. Aho and Davis said that they had not been too concerned about not having staked the anomaly area because the favourable rock assemblage was not found near the side of the anomaly. I should point out at this stage that we are talking about soil sample #5, and that by "favourable rock assemblage" I am speaking of the limestone-phyllite contact.

In view of the fact that no outcrop occurs on strike north of the claim group, I think that some geochemistry should be programmed between the north limit of the claims and False Canyon Creek early in the season. We may wish to call a meeting to determine what crew could best be made available to do this work.

Since there is a very permanent break showing-up on the aerial photographs cutting the north and south showings, it may well be that this same break extends beyond the claim group to the north, where we know nothing whatever about the geology.
