
Would you send me some funds to purchase the proper maps for you?

Dear Mr. Murphy:

I am writing in reference to your letter of January 30th to our president, Mr. J. H. Stovel, concerning your silver prospect in the Yukon. We thank you for your letter.

We would appreciate it very much if you would describe its location a little more specifically. Do you have any specimens you could forward to me on loan to see?

We are a reputable company and you need not fear that if you told us too much we would use the information to our own advantage behind your back.

In cases such as this in which a person tells us about an unstaked prospect he knows about, we have a short form agreement which we sign which states that we will examine the prospect and if we like it we will stake it and the prospector will be entitled to a 10% vendors interest - not 50% as you are requesting.
