Dear Members:

I have authentic information of what sounds like a most important HEMATITE find now being staked in Yukon by one of the larger of the major companies. I believe this find to be important from the following as told to me and considered a fact:

1. The find was made last fall.
2. At present there are a number of geologists taking part in the staking, at least three Ph.Ds, one lawyer, 22 men staking 1/2 mile iron claims and 30 men arriving when the ice opens up.
3. No mail allowed out of camp.

Surely an organization such as this with a winter to think over the whole economic picture could not all be dreamers.

In my way of thinking, to do a proper job of staking in this area, it will take an otter on floats, two helicopters, two pilots for each helicopter, and possibly three or four geologists with mountain mapping experience. This last I believe is most important. There is at least one Bell G2 available in Whitehorse, possibly two for a short time, at \$103 per hour, but only one pilot for each available.

The above program could not start for at least ten days or more and it will take at least that long to organize. The news will not be out until at least the end of the month, perhaps longer. This will give us quite a jump on other unorganized groups cannot stake in this area.

As you are all more seasoned in the exploration field than the writer, I do not have to stress security.

The dates of this information must be most confidential lest they coincide with peoples movements in Alberta. It is most important that I be kept absolutely in the background, and most important not discussed with any of your Yukon representatives. This does not mean that you may not enquire as to what knowledge they may have of the above, only that I be kept out of it.

In my opinion this has absolutely nothing to do with the Mount Nansen Exploration Syndicate. Legally, I am not obliged to pass on any such information to any or all of you. Morally, I feel this is the only proper way to work it.

Would suggest, if interested, that you appoint a spokesman for the group, or new syndicate, whichever the case may be, and send him to Whitehorse to work out the details. All legal work **MUST** be done in Toronto, and this whole organization must appear to be eastern engineered.

I am thinking in terms of a 25% vendor interest for passing on the information and assisting in organizing. I already have photographs of the exact area. (Aerial)

As I have my own aircraft, I can flit in and out of the Nansen area in an hour each way. In this way the work there will not be neglected. When on my own business there is naturally no charge to the Syndicate.

I will feel a little foolish if this is current gossip on Bay Street.
