Subject New Staking By Kulan & Associates -  
Watson Lake Area, Y.T. (105-H-14) Date January 22, 1968

In the October issue of Mining Statistics, N.W.T. and Yukon, there is evidence that Kulan et al staked the Thor #1 - 1,396 M.C.'s. This area is approximately 40 miles north of Francis Lake and is presumably somewhere near a granite contact.

My only purpose in mentioning this is that out of sixty stakers involved, or supposedly involved, twenty-seven were women. This has to be one of the most flagrant cases of the use of phoney affidavits I have ever encountered, but it is sanctioned by mining recorders as long as no one protests.

Since Ron Connelly (also a staker) probably flew the various people to the area it would be rather difficult to prove fraud. The simplest way would be to get one of the Indian women drunk. I suggest you investigate this approach next time you are in the Yukon since you did such a good job in Upper Volta. I agree however that because of prevailing temperatures in the Yukon, this work would not be as interesting. Aromatically, there is probably some similarity.
