This is prompted by your memorandum of December 14th on this subject.

I have phoned Paul Hammond of Conwest and the following is what he has told me.

George Fairclough found the little zone 2 or 3 years ago while prospecting for Conwest in and about the north fork of the Ketzka River. Conwest was very excited at first and Paul Hammond rushed in to have a look. The high assays Fairclough reports are correct, but disappointingly the mineralization occurs in little quartz stringers which are all chopped up and all of which don't appear to be going anywhere. The country rock is argillite. The zone is well exposed - probably too well exposed. Fairclough staked 30 or more claims this summer around the 4 held by Conwest. Conwest intends to return the 4 claims to Fairclough but is awaiting a formal request from Fairclough before doing so.

The only thing I would recommend about this property is that if convenient Al or one of us plan on examining it next summer.

GEORGE FAIRCLOUGH CLAIMS - KETZA AREA

During our telephone conversation today, Al mentioned that George Fairclough of Whitehorse now has 38 claims on what he calls the "Rusty Group". He found this showing three years ago and optioned it to Conwest. Conwest, until just recently, held 4 of these claims in their own name but apparently now have released them to Fairclough.

Al states that there are 10 different exposures on which the lowest assay is 40 ozs. of silver, but that there is a persistent spread of values of from 138 - 400 ozs. of silver across 3'.

Fairclough is asking \$150,000.00 plus 150,000 shares.

Al appears to think that this property has considerable merit, but it remains to be explained why Conwest have not done something with it.

Obviously I cannot make a recommendation one way or the other on the information given to me, but perhaps you can learn something more about it in Toronto or, conceivably, you already know about this particular showing.
