After receiving your phone call the other night about Newmont's staking 300 claims in the vicinity of Starr Creek (105-6/12), I looked up the aeromagnetic data and there is a great cluster of anomalies northwest of Starr Creek which denote nothing but miocene basalt. Consequently, would you please try to give me a more accurate fix on the location of the staking so that we can plot the information on the correct aeromagnetic sheet.

I talked to Don Cannon briefly yesterday and he intimated that the staking resulted largely from prior knowledge of that area rather than from any magnetic anomalies as such.

There is still nothing on the Starr Creek sheet, or the adjacent sheet, which I would consider diagnostic of mineralization, but I am curious as to what evidence they did have. Anything you can learn along these lines would be very much appreciated.

Sirola phoned to say that Kulan phoned April 16th to say that Newmont were staking 300 claims about 25-30 miles SE of Ross River. The location has numerous airborne magnetometer anomalies which Sirola thinks are caused by the Miocene basalt which covers that area. Sirola thinks that Kulan may not have the location of the staking accurately pinpointed.

Sirola ran into D. Cannon, the Newmont representative, and said something to him about the staking. Cannon claimed that they had "prior knowledge" or, in other words, other reasons than the anomalies for staking. Sirola says Newmont have been active in that area for some years. Kulan had talked with one of the Newmont prospectors and he claimed that the staking could be on the anomalies. Newmont have a Sherrit Gordon Beechcraft fitted out with geophysical equipment on the job.

Sirola thought that we do not have sufficient information or reason to do tie-on staking as suggested by Kulan. I agreed.
