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VANGORDA PROPERTY, VANGORDA CREEK AREA, Y.T.
PROPOSED EXPLORATION

6th April 1976

In 1971, and unbeknownst to Kerr Addison, Anvil Mining Corporation drilled a dozen or so diamond drill holes through the overburden and into 30' of bedrock, in an effort to determine whether or not there were other drilling targets on the Vangorda claims. We learned of this tactic three years ago and at that time obtained some of the logs of these drill holes. More recently we received the balance of the logs and one drill hole, 71-159, drilled on the S.E. corner of Jack #4 M.C. contained anomalous Pb, Zn and Cu values. The nearest Prospectors Airways drill hole (PDH #9) is 800' to the South West, on Jack #2 M.C.

PDH #9 was drilled to a depth of 85' and had very poor (30%) core recovery. The rock type is described as pearl grey to talcose schist with pyrite, pyrrhotite and traces of chalcopyrite from 51 to 55'. In to-day's nomenclature, the rock would be called a bleached muscovite phyllite and this form of alteration only occurs in the presence of sulphides and is usually peripheral to massive sulphides. The situation is further enhanced by the presence of a gravity nose in the South West corner of the Jack #2 M.C.

In as much as our partners in the Grum Joint Venture will be doing additional exploration on the Vangorda claims as part of the Vangorda-AEX agreement, I have suggested to Dr. Reamsbottom that he consider the examination of this area as part of their work commitment this summer.
