PROPERTY: BEAR MAP LOCATION NO. 2

COMMODITY: ZINC

LOCATION: 64° 35' North, 130° 37' West - about 180 miles ENE of Mayo, Y.T., on the north fork of the Mountain River, N.W.T.

ACCESS: From Mayo, Y.T. by fixed wing to Guber Lake, N.W.T., then by helicopter 10 miles SSE to the property.

TOPOGRAPHY: The claims are at an elevation of 4000 feet and cover part of the valleys of the Mountain River and of a small northwest flowing tributary on the east side of the river.

PROPERTY: Ten claims - Bear 1 - 10 in good standing until July 1975.

GEOLOGY: The claims cover a low scarp 50 - 100 feet high along the northeast side of a small creek flowing northwest into Mountain River. The scarp exposes yellow-weathering (limonitic) dolomitic limestone which dips at a low angle to the southwest. The cliff along the southwest side of the creek, perhaps 200 feet wide, is formed of black shale which overlies the dolomite. Zinc carbonate is widely distributed on weathered surfaces with sphalerite mainly confined to fractures. This section is exposed for at least 1000 feet along strike but the primary zinc content is probably quite low.

CONCLUSIONS: Detailed geological mapping and sampling are required
