Dear Mike,

I am sorry to have missed you on my trip into the 60-Mile and I trust that it has not interfered with your activities. I left a note pinned to the door of your cabin at Glacier Creek explaining that I had searched in every place and had found no indication of where I could contact you. Due to shortage of time I did not feel that I could spend additional days looking for you and then further time that would be necessary to go out to examine your discoveries.

In any case, you will probably have a better opportunity to open up the showings and to do further work in the area by means of soil sampling and, therefore, you will have much more to see a little later in the season when it may be more convenient for me to get together with you.

If you wish to have your soil samples analyzed for lead and zinc, you could send them to our laboratory addressed to Dynasty Explorations Limited, Box 1057, Whitehorse, Y.T., with the notation that they are geochemical samples to be analyzed and charged to me.

Thank you for your map of the Jem group of claims which, as you say, are more probably on a break along which the mercury mineralization is localized. I would also be interested in discussing this further with you.

The importance of James Millar's staking will depend on whether they bring in some ^{claims} and do some work to try to determine the source of the mercury. In this area, as in your silver prospect, soil sampling and gold panning for mercury would be the most successful means of initial exploration.
