Dear Sir.

We are returning to Grayling lake, and, will prospect to the north including Porcupine creek, since we do not know, when we can meet and you will be busy at Watson lake. If you have another area in mind we should go. The Focher will be at Grayling at certain times, and make it a date for him to be there at. Sep 4. We have not made any discovery of Impromptus, that we know of. assay to-morrow will tell. The Grants for the claim are here, and we are taking the logs along. The Transfer can wait. We are having a problem now; Jim or I cannot stake the claim since he have already staked 8 Claims apiece. So Taylor Magendy has to stake them for us. And since this is now in the Watson lake Mining District, we cannot find out when those Claim Grant and Fed expire. So we like to get a report on it, send to Grayling lake

We should have enough grub to last us to Oct 10. if we get fresh meat, and there is plenty of it around. McNeil Lake is crowded with prospectors and Grant Yellowknife have party's now making water and soil test in Ketra River, Mc Connell creek, and streams in between. The main party has moved to Frances Lake it is understood. We had plenty of rain, and seen the Geese going South already. Since I had no ~~other~~ transportation we are staying at Capital Hotel, and return to Gravelly soon as possible. I hope you have something of value at Watson Lake and we will do our best to find something good. I am told that you will take the bus to Watson Lake soon as you get here, so we better carry on as we are doing. There are rock and mineral Complexes at Clem Eminger's Place, and I would like to keep them, if you do not want any assays off them. The plane will have to pick us up at Rapid Lake or Seagull if it is not frozen by Oct 10. or come out by road, if that is still open. The plane at Rapid is perhaps the best.

Dear Harry:

Thank you for your letter of May 13th about the German prospector, Gunter Lishy. I have had a letter from him and have replied to him inquiring about his discovery at Blue River.

Regarding our summer programme we will come in to examine the showing on the 19th and 20th and will get work started on it about the same time. Mr. David Sharpstone of Homestake Mining Co. will be with me on the 19th and 20th and we are also going through to Mayo on the 10th. If it is not inconvenient you should meet the plane on the 10th so that we may have a chance to talk briefly before we continue on to Mayo. I have been unable to get a good geologist yet, and only have a junior assistant, John Brock, who is presently at Mayo. We had planned to send him in on the 11th or 12th, however, as it stands now we will probably delay that until the 19th. I am wiring Lloyd Romfo and Klondike Helicopters to arrange for a Beaver-load into Grayling Lake early on the morning of the 19th and for the Conwest Helicopter to pick us up there on that day. Sharpstone would probably go back in a day or two and I may remain longer.

You should try to get in about a week before, say around the 12th, with Jim and see if the showings can be cleaned off and a little preparation and prospecting done before Sharpstone arrives. We will try to arrange for a further crew to take over after the 20th and leave you free for prospecting to the north. In any case we hope to see you on the 10th.
