Introduction

From May 31 to June 10, 1966 the Carol Mineral Claims and their surrounding area was investigated geologically by Allan Sangster, geologist under the employ of Atlas Explorations. The Carol 1-8 claims are currently held by Atlas Explorations Limited and have recently been re-examined by airborne geophysical, ground geophysical and geochemical methods in order to determine their potential for extending known zones of sulphide mineralization. ~~The~~ Geologic follow-up has been provided by Allan Sangster of Atlas Explorations who conducted a mapping program and W. Walker of Chew Walker and Associates who provided an air-photo geologic interpretation.

Location and Access

The 8 claim group is centered 6 1/4 miles east northeast of the east end of Little Salmon Lake in the Whitehorse mining district of the Yukon Territory, or about 105 miles in a direction N 15° ~~xxx~~ E from the town of Whitehorse.

During the time ~~of xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ geologic work was done on the claim group access to the property was made by foot from a base camp at Taylor Lake, some five miles southeast of Drury Lake. The base camp was provisioned by fixed wing aircraft ~~xxxx~~ are able to land on Taylor Lake, and by helicopter from the village of Ross River.

Previous Work

In 1963, KerrAddison Mines conducted geophysical surveys and a limited diamond drilling program on the Carol claim group then under option to them by Alan Kulan of Whitehorse. Sangster located the diamond drill holes and logged the existing core found on the property as part of his geologic evaluation for Atlas Explorations.
