Dear Michael:

Thank you very much for submitting to us your maps covering the Flip Claims.

A geochemical plot on zinc soil sampling results is not really very interesting, as the results are below background for the area your claims are in. At 0+00W 5+00N there is a single evaluation high of 203 ppm but this cannot be considered anomalous as within the Anvil area anomalous zones are usually in excess of 1000 ppm.

The lead anomaly with high value of 125 ppm at 4+00N 0+00W is anomalous and a slight build-up to this anomalous value appears over a few hundred feet. As an anomaly is shown to the NE, I suggest that some soil sampling be done in this area.

The S.P. survey provides you with some anomalies but I suspect the conductors are graphite.

In view of the present and available information on the Flip Claims, we are unable to consider participation with you at this time.

Thank you very much for giving us first opportunity and I wish you success in dealing off your property elsewhere.
