Enclosed, herewith, is a summary report on the Joe and Fair claims around the junction of Anvil and Rose Creeks, made for New Far North Explorations and Consolidated Bellenkeno Mines by Watts, Griffis and McQuat Limited.

I do not know what information Murray Hampton, or other Anvil people have on this area, but a geochemical and gravity anomaly indicated on the Joe #1 - #4 and #11 - #12 claims may be of some significance. Our reconnaissance did not cover this specific locality, although I recall we did get some scattered zinc kicks south of this locality. My general impression is that this may not be a top-priority target, and may be caused by limited zones of mineralization, and that gravity might be caused by greenstone or other bedrock conditions.

There does not appear to be any reference to lead in the geochemical results, but this could be masked on the north-facing slope. In any case, it would appear to be advisable to follow up and try to obtain further detailed information to see if any action may be warranted.

This property has been submitted to me by R. W. Falkins of Highmont Mines here in Vancouver. I will tell him that I have forwarded this report to you.

I have received the report on the Joe and Fair Claims submitted by you, and have taken the liberty of passing on a copy to R. E. Thurmond, General Manager of Anvil, for his further consideration.

During previous reconnaissance of the area, we had detected some scattered copper and zinc anomalies in this area, as well as green stone, which would contribute nickel as well as copper to the chemical results. Accordingly, the target outlined is not considered to be of high priority since the geochemistry may be caused by scattered mineralization and the gravity could be caused by greenstone. However, I have suggested that this be given further consideration, particularly if detailed backup data could be provided for a more definite evaluation of the merits of the property.

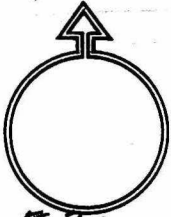

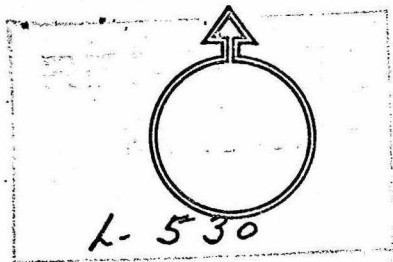
