Louis Brown has brought his abovementioned properties to the attention of Atlas Explorations (June 10, 1969, John Brock, Whitehorse).

Brown has been prospecting the ultra basic belt between All Gold Creek and Dawson City for nickle and has located several areas of nickle-bearing rock as determined by field testing (dimethol). Most of these areas have been staked. Spectrographic analysis of four samples submitted from various locations along the belt run low in nickle, .1 to .2 percent. Assays by TSL Laboratories on samples submitted by Brown.

Although the grades are not of economic interest, the location of the ultra-basic belt and its relation to the Tintina Fault, could make good prospecting country. The aeromagnetic expressions related to the basic units in the area are a good guide for prospecting.

Louis Brown will contact Ken Dawson at the Tintina Gravel Lake camp sometime on either June 12 or 13. The claim groups will then be examined by Dawson and Brown with a helicopter and the belt will be generally recced. Upon detailed examination of the properties, some mapping, geochem sampling and sampling for assay is recommended, if favorable an option agreement can be arranged with Brown. I also recommend that any discovery Atlas may make within this belt as defined above, that can be attributed to information learned from Brown, be acknowledged by payment of a finders fee to Brown.

It is recommended that this be followed up in detail because of Brown's experience as a prospector and his connections with other finds such as in the Bonnet Plume area.

Dear Ken:

This letter is to introduce Mr. Louis Brown of Mayo, Yukon. Louis Brown is a prospector who has brought prospects to the attention of Atlas in the past.

Louis has been carrying out some staking in the ultra basic belt between All Gold Creek and Dawson City, bounded on the southwest and northeast by Hunker Creek and the Klondike River.

It is Louis' theory that these basic units have potential for nickel and indeed he has found several nickle bearing (low grade) sections that he has already staked.

I suggest that either you or Collin spend some time with Louis, using the helicopter, and recce the belt as well as visiting the properties he has staked. As we are going to be working in the area our attentions should be concentrated in this belt for nickle prospects.

If anything on Louis Brown's existing claim groups is of interest to us we will engage him in a normal option agreement. If we follow up on some of his suggestions and stake properties on his suggestion, he will be paid a 'finders fee'.

- 1) Louis Brown nickle showings, All Gold Creek-Dawson City area Properties submitted to Atlas Explorations for examination by Louis Brown, prospector of Mayo.
- 2) Montreal Mike showings, see company files and refer to Lou Murray, Postmistress of Dawson City, telephone 4196
- 3) Windy John, part time prospector of Dawson-Whitehorse, claims to have staked some ground, copper showings, Dempster Highway area. This is rumour only but may bear some checking out around Dawson
- 4) In 1968, Gordon Davis was to examine a tungsten prospect around Haggart Creek, Mayo-McQuesten area, property belongs to Gordon McLeod of Mayo. Davis never got on ground but if you see McLeod around you might ask him if he is still interested in us having a look at his showings.

Lots of other companies are on radio frequency 4441 now and from my few days in Whitehorse it seems that some of them are overly interested in the Tintina Project, some security on the radio will likely be a good thing. Place names (topographic) and descriptions should be disguised from now on, if only to confound evesdroppers.
