Hi Jesse,

While at Roundup, I was approached (separately) by Dorothy Dick and Rod Snow (representing the FN) to see about the possibility of me going to Ross River to talk with them about the geology where I've been working and the general mineral potential of their traditional lands. Last week, I met with Rod and Victor Mitander to discuss this further and it seems like there is a more solid level of interest in a visit. They want to know more specifically about the geology of the interim-protected blocks in the core of the Finlayson Lake district (the highly prospective blocks south of Wolverine Lake and across from the GP4F deposit). They would also be interested in hearing about the geology of the dinosaur track locality, possibly as a school visit,

and about the mineral potential studies that we do and have done in this office. They're going to set something up and get back to me at some point.

In the course of last weeks' meeting, I got the distinct impression that they would like to see more 'lobbying' in their community from the mining-related interests in the territory, including us. I was told that the community gets regular lobbying-type visits from the Renewable Resources crew and the usual preservationist-oriented suspects whose transparent agenda is to deny land and access to the minerals community; very little has been forthcoming from mineral development interests except from Expatriate (with whom the FN is currently negotiating a benefits agreement). They want to hear more.

How would you feel about visits by myself to discuss Finlayson lake geology, Grant Lowey to present on the dinosaur tracks, Anna Fonseca to present her mineral potential studies, and Jeff Bond to talk about the surficial and till geochemistry work. It also sounded like they would appreciate being 'facilitated' by yourself. A whole delegation showing up for one visit may be a bit much; it would probably make more of an impact to do a series of visits. What do you think?

I'll let you know when I hear more.

Hi,

The Representative Public Service Plan developed by the Yukon Government commits to working with First Nation Governments by "holding joint information sessions, e.g. Internet, Career Days... to aid in meeting the strategy of Increasing representation of Yukon First Nations people in Yukon Government. The Champagne & Aishihik First Nation Government (CAFN) has also included this in their Traditional Territory Plan requesting that "Departments assist the CAFN in providing career planning information to students in areas of potential employment with YTG." Now as a result I am forwarding this e-mail from the CAFN requesting that Yukon Government participate in their career fair for their youth membership.

Last year Yukon Government participated in the Teslin Tlingit Council's career fair and our presence was significant and appreciated by the First Nation Government. Last year specific Departments were targeted, however this year the CAFN would like as many Departments to participate that can. They have two buildings booked for the Career Fair in Haines Junction, the Community Hall and the Convention Centre. The CAFN is looking for booths only. Last year we had booths and presentations.

I have discussed with CAFN about the involvement of YG last year and they liked all of the booths that was provided last year Renewable, Yukon Housing Corp, Education's Advanced Education - Apprenticeship Programs, Student Financial Assistance and Awards, Having a Native Language Instructor co-host with the Yukon Native Language Centre, Family & Children Services Branch (How to set up a Daycare). In addition to this they have put in other requests if at all possible. I will list them.

- Nursing Booth
- Engineering
- Technical - Computer
- Economic Development - such as the GIS mapping (others to)
- Aviation & Marine
- Sports & Recreation Branch - NAIG - S. Roach
- Geologist
- Biologists
- Heritage
- Education's - First Nation's Education Consultant of the curriculum developed - S. Jacobs.
- Any Careers willing to participate
- Existing Booths

It is also a good idea to have as many first nations people occupying the booth as possible only because it provides for good role models, but certainly not necessary. CAFN is looking forward to as many booths as the YG can provide, as well there will be other organizations involved. For logistics it is also a good idea to have the local (Haines Junction) employees participate from those Departments in Haines Junction. I have provided a map of Haines Junction, the convention center is not on there but is located to the right of number 5.

A good way to participate is by using existing booths that Departments already possess. They can easily be adapted to the Career Fair by identifying all of the careers involved with the booth. The CAFN is also asking for give aways that the Departments may have such as mugs, canvas bags etc. so they can have draws though out the day, but booth providers can certainly have their own draws to encourage the youth to their booth.



I am requesting that I receive a c.c on all registrations so that I can make certain that the booth requirements are going to be met, the Directors may want a c.c. as well in order to know your level of participation, but please send your registration directly to the CAFN. As I did last year I plan to go to Haines Junction to meet and greet any of the YG booth providers to ensure that your needs are met for a smooth set up. The CAFN is also providing lunch on the day of the Career Fair.

Sorry for the short notice but I only received the confirmed date yesterday. If you have any questions or would like to discuss your booth you can call me at 667-3486. Thank you for your participation in this important event for the CAFN. It is events like this this that builds the relationship between the YG and First Nation Governments as well as the investment in the youth.
