

This River is said to have over the miles streambed navigation, and is called a cataraicta pair of the Hodelinga River, Hodelingonett. In the way of it 40 miles and found gold in the way of it but it is said that they can travel from the head of the river to Sitka landing on the river in a day.

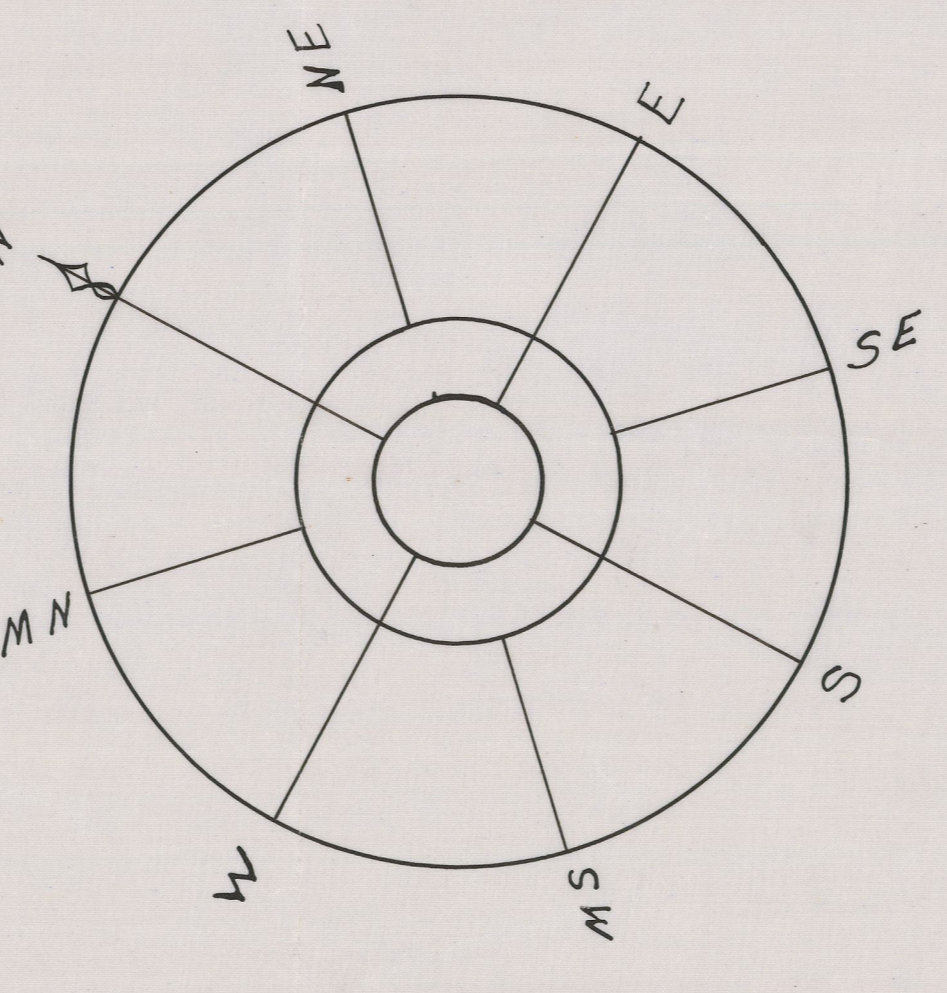
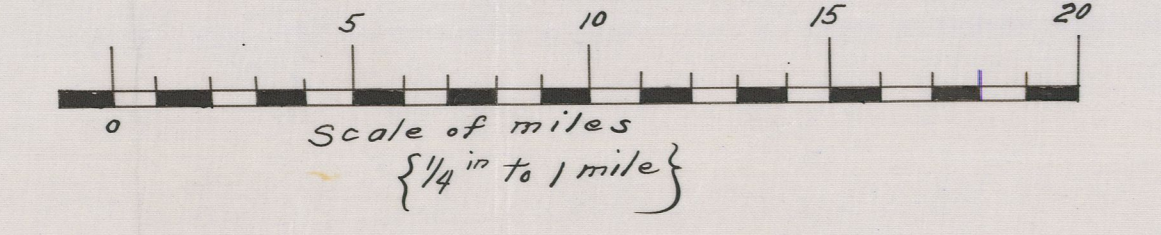
The estimated distance from the foot of the lake to where a light draft steamer can run up the Takou River (which can run up the coast) is 140 miles. 35 miles up is good traveling.

This passage is about 100 miles to where a light draft steamer can run up in the Takou River.

Remarks - Information on Arksen Lake, the upper Hodelinga River, and the upper Salmon, was obtained from the Takou Chief, Robert Kuta and other Indians and was confirmed by Bennett & Hove. J. M. Cocomac and others all of whom has travelled through that section of Country. The balance has all come under my own observation. Men Pains along Lakes Linderman Bennett runs about to the waters edge.
